Another bit of good news is that the LHS Class Challenge Golf Tournament, an event that began 10 years ago by our Oahu Lahainaluna faithful, will continue for the foreseeable future. The Foundation has opted to assume responsibility for its perpetuation so we will be hosting this event for 2018 again on Oahu at the Hawaii Prince Golf Club in July. Details will be forthcoming after the first of the year.

As we wind down 2017, your Foundation reflects back on the accomplishments of the past and also the challenges of the future and where it will take us. We are transitioning from a board that was blessed with an excess of money to one that needs to learn how to be more of a fundraising group. This has proven to be a difficult transition because we weren't prepared for this. As we make this hard turn, we will ask for a greater participation from the Luna community to help us in our efforts to continue being a Foundation to change things for the better. 
